Amendment to LBR 9010-1 Standards of Professional Conduct

1. Proposed LBR 2090-1 Attorneys – Admission to Practice.

- a. While it has been a longstanding requirement that attorneys who practice in the Bankruptcy Court of the Middle District of Georgia must be admitted to the District Court of the Middle District of Georgia, the requirement is not codified in our local rules as is the case in many other districts. Similarly, the requirement regarding *pro hac vice* admissions is not codified in our local rules.
 - b. The proposed local rule for attorney admissions and *pro hac vice* admissions is:

LBR 2090-1 Attorneys – Admission to Practice

Any attorney appearing in this Court shall have complied with the Middle District of Georgia District Court Local Rule 83.1.1 for attorney admissions or 83.1.2.C for *pro hac vice* admissions.
